With ten of the eleven first stringers being Seniors, the Mustangs could easily be the most experienced team in the city.

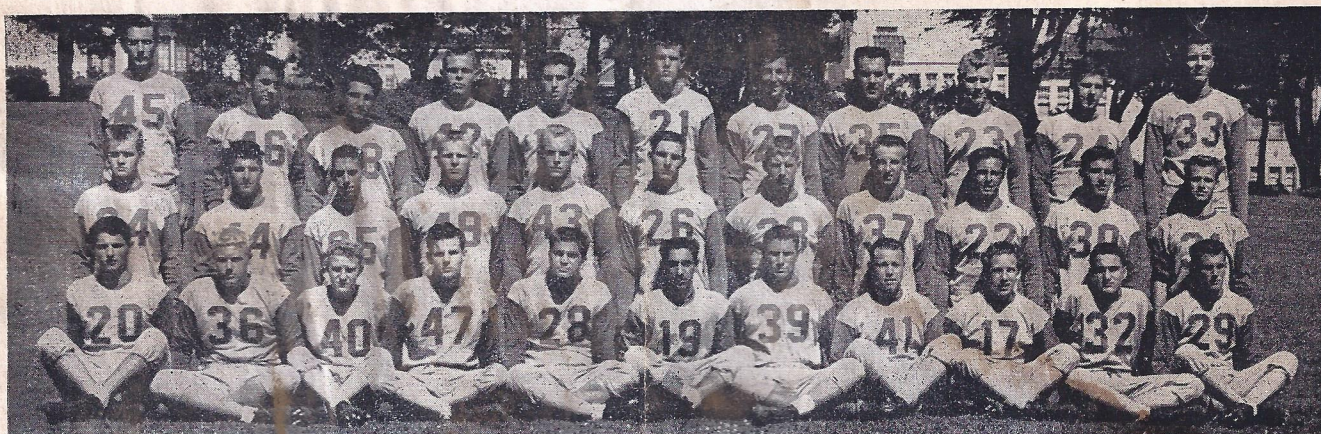

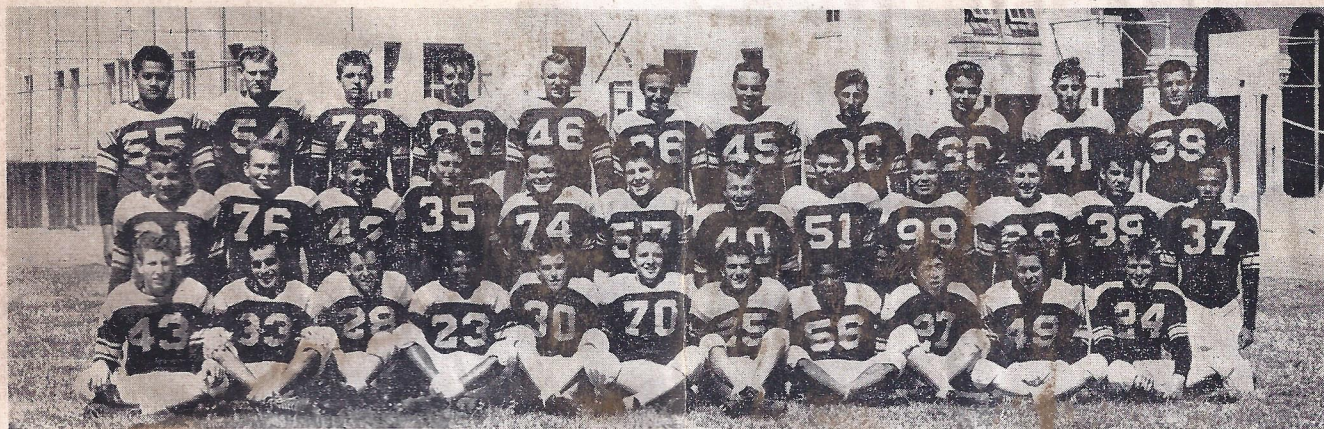

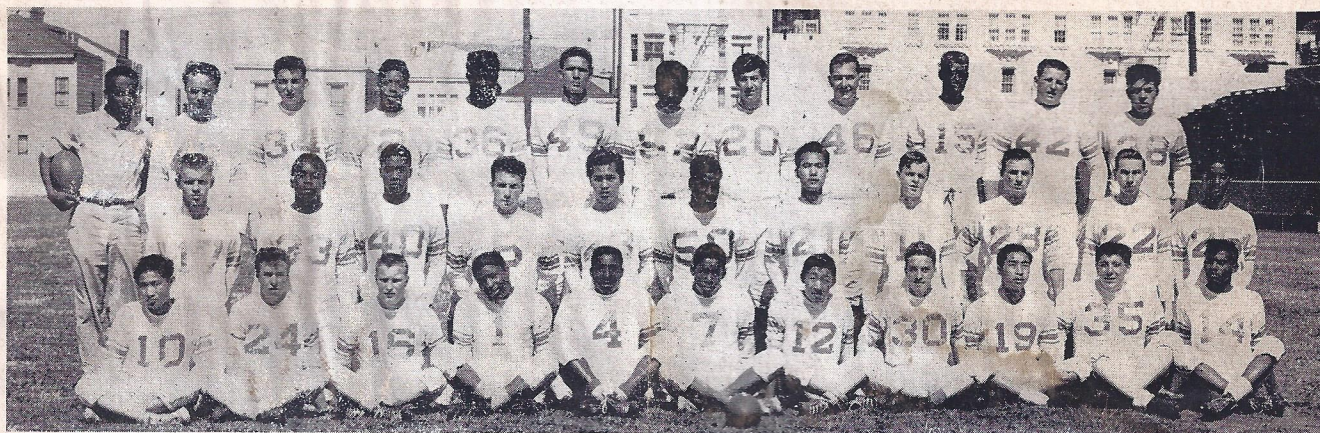
In the backfield there is probably more all around speed than in previous years. Inexperience may hurt, nevertheless boys like

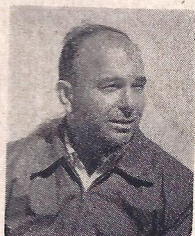




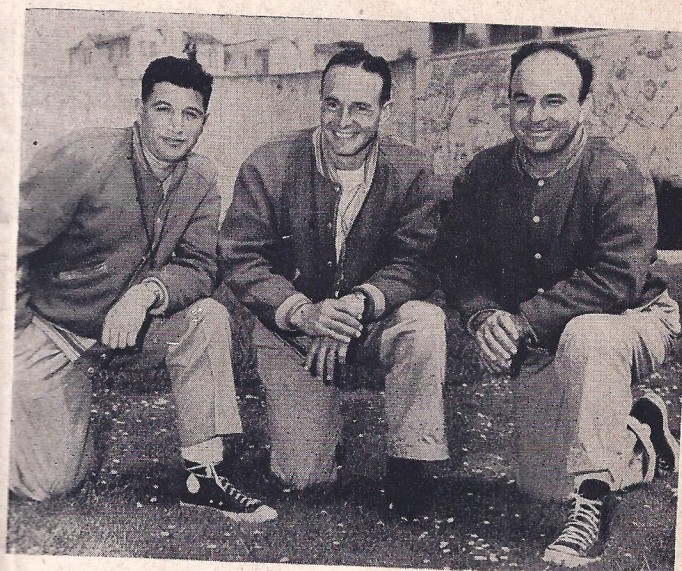

Much is expected from these boys coming up from last year's

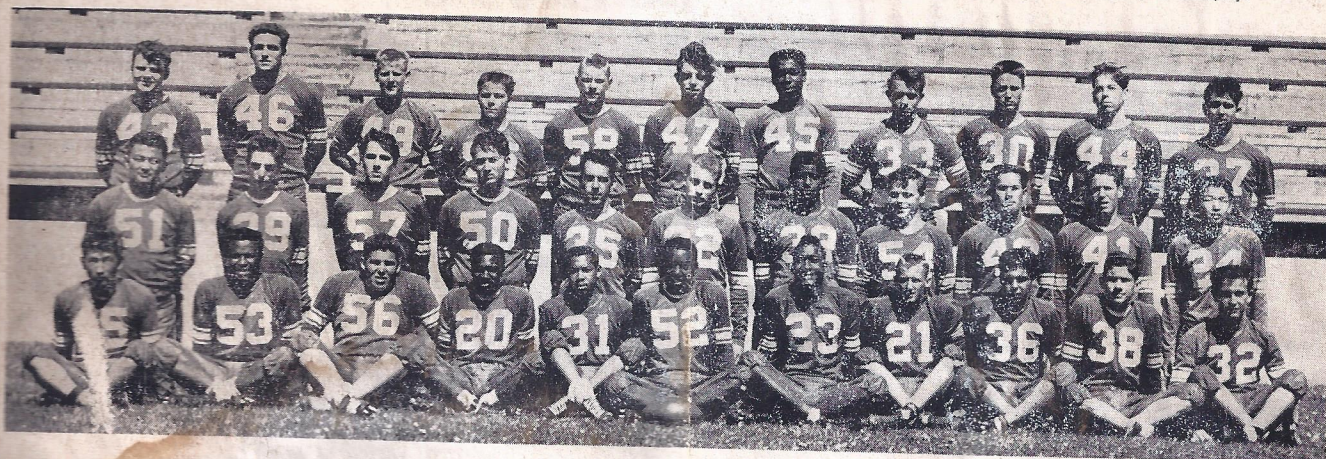

The enrollment is to be taken as of Thursday, September 15, 1955, and is to include those students who had attended school anytime during the first week and are enrolled on Thursday, September 15.

Today the Fifth Annual Prep Football Pageant introduces the 1955 San Francisco High School Football Season.

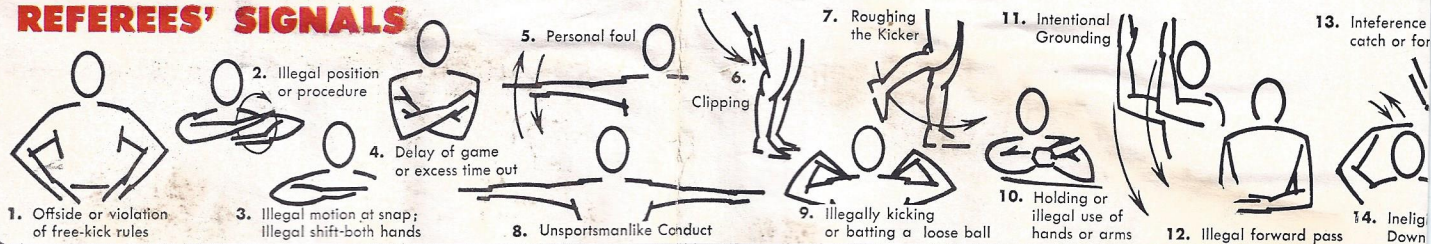

The rest of the starting eleven should find John Kindsfather at center; Bob Unger at guard; Bob Moore at tackle, and Mike Mattson at end.

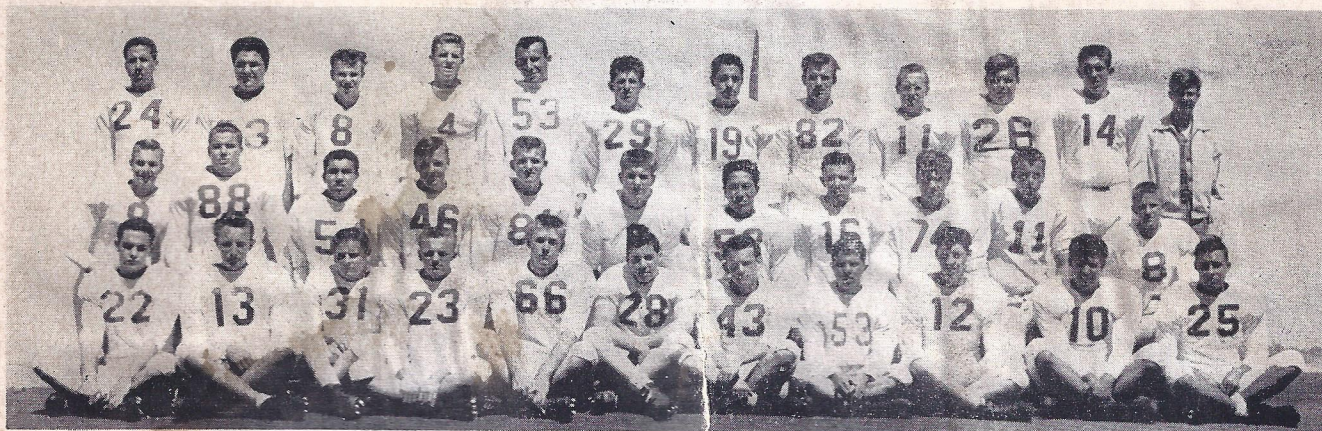

record. Ted Cano, who filled in for injured Mitchell Keller during the final game, should nail down the fullback spot.

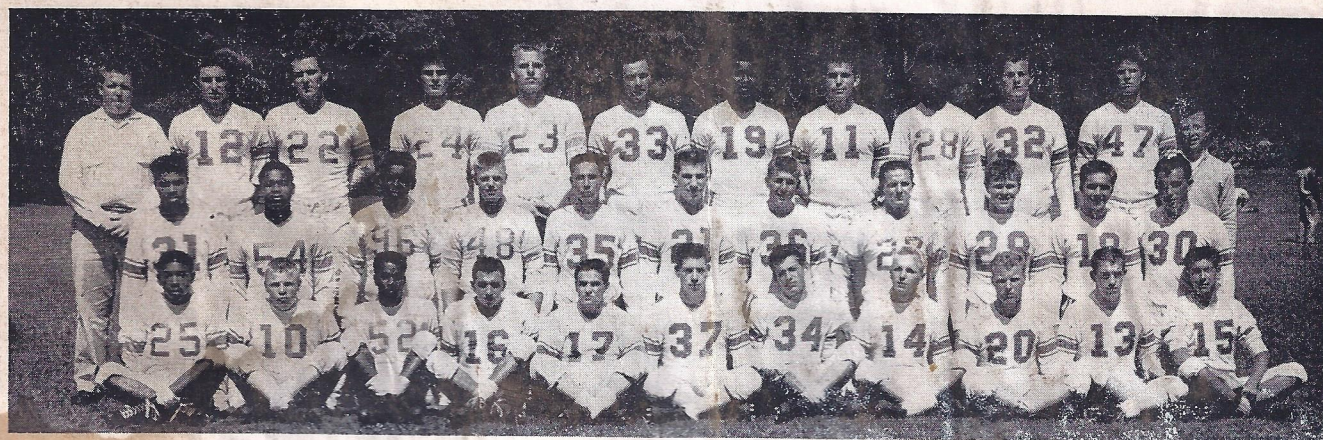
